Table 1. Summary of statistics describing niche shifts, and their main drivers, during wild boar invasion in the Neotropical, Australian and Nearctic biogeographical regions. Equivalence and Similarity ($E \rightarrow N$: from exotic to native; $N \rightarrow E$: from native to exotic) are measured in terms of observed niche overlap (Schoener's D). Asterisks indicate rejection of null hypothesis (p-value < 0.05), from comparisons of observed vs random measures of niche overlap. Expansion and Stability are proportions of the exotic niche non-overlapping and overlapping, respectively, with the native niche. Unfilling is the proportion of the native niche, present but non-occupied in the exotic niche (details in text).
