Table 1. Summary of statistics describing niche shifts, and their main drivers, during wild boar invasion in the Neotropical, Australian and Nearctic biogeographical regions. Equivalence and Similarity (E → N: from exotic to native; N → E: from native to exotic) are measured in terms of observed niche overlap (Schoener's *D*). Asterisks indicate rejection of null hypothesis (p-value < 0.05), from comparisons of observed vs random measures of niche overlap. Expansion and Stability are proportions of the exotic niche non-overlapping and overlapping, respectively, with the native niche. Unfilling is the proportion of the native niche, present but non-occupied in the exotic niche (details in text).
