

## Niche conservatism and the invasive potential of the wild boar

**Table 1.** Summary of statistics describing niche shifts, and their main drivers, during wild boar invasion in the Neotropical, Australian and Nearctic biogeographical regions. Equivalence and Similarity ( $E \rightarrow N$ : from exotic to native;  $N \rightarrow E$ : from native to exotic) are measured in terms of observed niche overlap (Schoener's  $D$ ). Asterisks indicate rejection of null hypothesis ( $p$ -value  $< 0.05$ ), from comparisons of observed *vs* random measures of niche overlap. Expansion and Stability are proportions of the exotic niche non-overlapping and overlapping, respectively, with the native niche. Unfilling is the proportion of the native niche, present but non-occupied in the exotic niche (details in text).
